The Past

On 16th April 1977 a dream was realised when the brand new Edstaston Village Hall was opened after 3½ years of enthusiastic planning and fundraising by a strong and determined community.

The new Village Hall was built on the site of the previous "Hut", an ex-World War I wooden service hut. The Hut used to stand on the Old Prees Heath Camp a few miles across the fields from Edstaston. There was a collection among villagers to buy the hut and in 1922 it was reerected on land donated by the Cholmondeley family at the site of the current hall.

The Hut did yeoman service but by 1973 it was obvious it was beyond repair and a plan was launched to build a new hall. The Village Hall committee began the task of raising the then considerable £20,000 needed for the new hall. Considering this is equivalent to £167,000 in today's money this was a daunting prospect. They set about raising funds with true tenacity, with a white elephant shop, buy-a-brick scheme, bazaars, concerts and even a pancake race. In fact it seems there was little that happened in the community in those years that didn't contribute in some way to the fund. Their sterling efforts along with generous grants meant that by mid 1976 work was started on building the new hall.

The Present

Following the generous donation of land adjacent to the hall by the Price family the Edstaston Village Hall committee is delighted to report that plans have now been approved to provide a disabled toilet, new entrance lobby with good disabled access, well organised kitchen/bar area and stage area together with plenty of storage (see plan above right). The remaining land will be used as a multi-functional amenity area for summer events as well as much-needed space for overflow parking. We hope these improvements will make the hall more widely useful and appealing to ALL members of our community.

We are grateful to the community for their support at our events and numbers just keep growing! Our quiz night (including hotpot supper) in November attracted 19 teams and raised almost £900! Other recent events have included a Mini Beerfest, another quiz (with bangers and mash), a fantastic night with Alfie Moore (of BBC Radio 4's IT'S A FAIR COP series), an Elvis impersonator....

The village hall plays a critical role in keeping the existing community alive and does much to encourage newcomers to feel welcome. Edstaston Village Hall is the only community venue in the whole of the three wards of Wem Rural Parish and people from all parts of the parish come to our events. We are delighted to welcome 5 new committee members: Anna Thomas and Corrine Brown who will share the treasurer role, Trevor Gough, Ruth Williams and Hazel Rees.



Getting the plans approved is just the first step. The committee knows that it will take an enormous effort from the whole community to raise the funds necessary to finish this project.

A schedule of works has been compiled and tenders for building the extension are being invited. Grant applications are being written and will be submitted as soon as possible.

Edstaston Village Hall is a self-funded community facility and all the members of the committee are volunteers donating time and resources to keeping the hall alive. Any of the work we could do collectively as a community will cut the direct costs and make this project more likely to both proceed and succeed.
