I am very proud to report that Wem Rural Parish Council has been awarded the Gold Quality Mark following attendance at the Local Councils' Award Accreditation Panel Meeting at the Shirehall. I attended with Carole, our wonderful Clerk, to give a presentation and answer questions. The panel recognised our Council for being outstandingly proactive, highly committed and motivated to achieve improvements for our community. Our work with Wem Town, the Wem Economic Forum and Shropshire Council gained particular recognition for which Carole must be thanked. The panel felt that the Emergency Plan work has been outstanding!!

On Saturday 10th August I attended the opening of the Animal Au Pair in Northwood. I was invited by Linda Williams who must be congratulated for her hard work and enthusiasm for her new business. She also invited the Northwood community into her garden to share the event and use it as an opportunity as a fund raiser. £200 pounds was raised to spend on the future projects in the Northwood Community.

SmartWater

What is SmartWater?

SmartWater is a sophisticated security system that protects property, deters thieves and helps the police to convict criminals. It can be directly applied to valuables or it can be used to spray criminals committing a crime.

SmartWater contains a unique forensic code that is registered to an address or location. Anything marked can be traced back to where it came from, allowing the police to identify stolen property and link criminals to crime scenes. SmartWater is almost invisible in natural light but glows brightly under ultraviolet (UV) light.

Why Do Criminals Avoid SmartWater?

If a criminal is marked with SmartWater or caught with SmartWater-marked property, they face an increased risk of prosecution. SmartWater has helped to convict hundreds of criminals and has a 100% conviction rate. Police Forces nationwide, along with many second hand dealers, scrap merchants and recyclers are all looking for SmartWater.

Make Wem Rural Parish a Don't Buy Crime Area

If we can distribute SmartWater kits to over 70% of households in the Parish, the Council can claim a grant to fund the kits and provide signage.

'Peace Picnic'

This is a joint Community Event, organized by Newtown Area History and Heritage Group; Newtown Church; Northwood Chapel; Newtown Community Recreation Association (NCRA)

In the summer of 1919 huge celebrations were held throughout the country to joyfully mark the signing of the Versailles Peace Treaty that finally brought the Great War to an end. People remembered those who had fought, and those who died, but also celebrated 'the Peace'. The King granted a 'Peace Day Holiday' throughout the Country, and schools, including Newtown School, were granted an extra week onto their summer 'harvest holiday'.

The end of World War 1 would also be an important turning point in British history and society, bringing about many changes in the 20th century and beyond.

Just turn up! Bring along your own picnic, and perhaps a chair/picnic blanket and join us for a community day.

A chance to look back, and also a chance to look forward .



Community Speed Watch coming to Northwood!

First Community Speed Watch Group in the Parish

West Mercia Police have agreed that Northwood can set up a Community Speed Watch (CSW) Group. They have reviewed traffic speeds and agreed safe locations. Now we need the volunteers! There needs to be at least 6 volunteers come forward to set up the Group.

How will monitoring by the CSW Group be carried out?

The safety of all road users is paramount in any CSW area. The following rules must be adhered to at all times:

- ♦ Volunteers must not stand in the road at any time or obstruct the footpath.
- ♦ Volunteers must always work in group if three, with one operating as a 'safety lookout'.
- ♦ Checks should only take place during daylight hours at locations which have been agreed and approved.
- ♦ High visibility jackets must always be worn.
- ♦ At least one volunteer must be in possession of a mobile phone.

Volunteers will be covered by West Mercia Police public liability and personal accident insurance policies.

Can anyone become a volunteer?

CSW volunteering is open to anyone aged 18 or over.

Volunteers will only be accepted onto a Group once appropriate checks have been carried out.

Police National Computer Check Consent Forms can be obtained from the Parish Clerk.

Volunteers must be able to make regular commitment to carry out monitoring and must adhere to the CSW scheme's safety rules at all times. Although reasonable adjustments can be made, volunteers should be mindful of the physical nature of the role.

Training will be provided covering areas such as health and safety, legislation and how to use the speed detection equipment.

West Mercia police reserve the right to withdraw permission for an individual to participate in a Group.

Although Northwood CSW Group is the first in the Parish, the Parish Council hopes that it will not be the only one. If you are interested in setting up a CSW Group in your area of the Parish why not talk to your neighbours? If we can assure there are 6 volunteers ready to step up it helps the case for West Mercia to review the location. Please contact your ward Parish Councillor or the Clerk.
